GARY MORRIS is known world-wide for his vocal mastery. His recording career garnered five #1 and 16 Top 10 singles, including "Why Lady Why," "The Love She Found in Me," "Baby Bye Bye." Morris' original rendition of the classic "Wind Beneath My Wings" won both the Country Music Association and Academy of Country Music "Song of the Year" awards. JASON COLEMAN & MEAGAN TAYLOR grew up with two legends at their instruments. Coleman's grandfather is the legendary pianist Floyd Cramer whose "slip note" piano style was an essential part of countless country, pop, and rock hits in the 1950s and '60s and exemplified by his 1960 smash hit, "Last Date".
