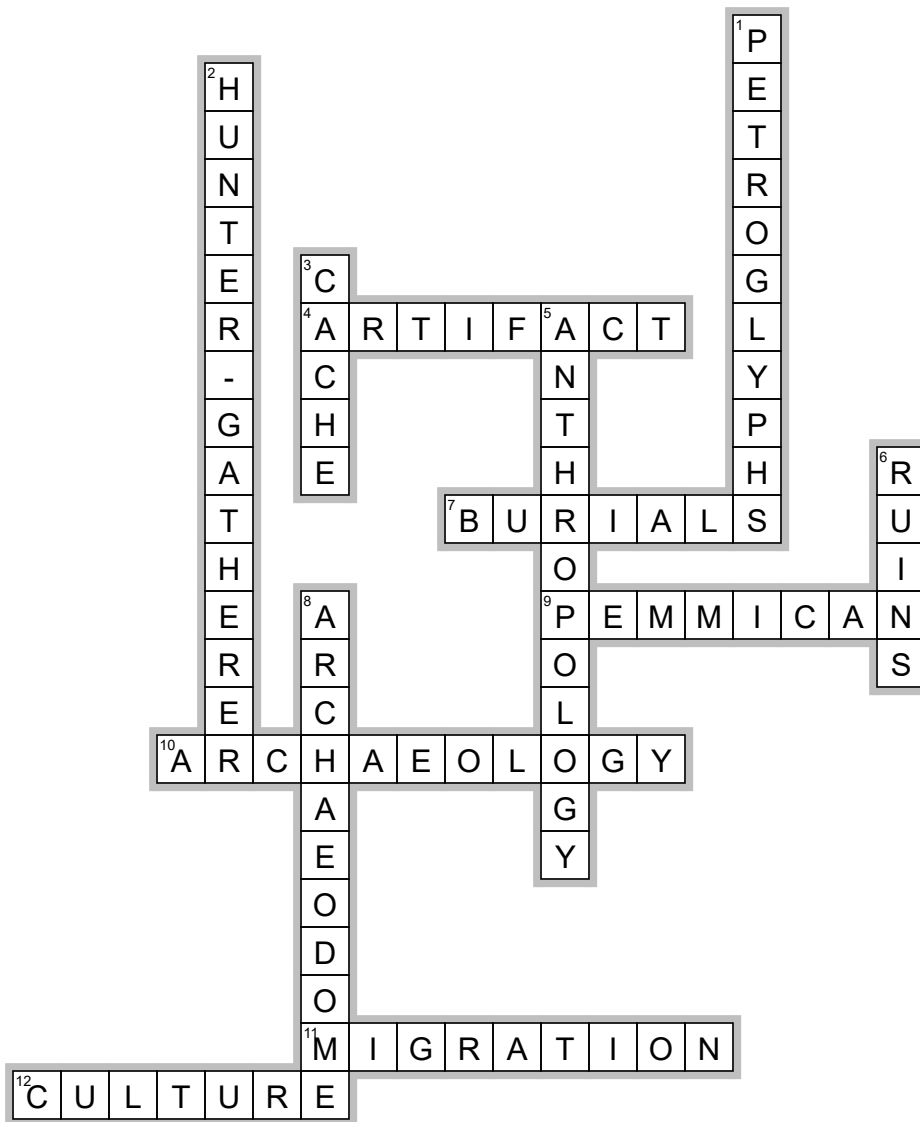


Dakota Pathways: The First Hunters and Farmers
