

- 3. Super hard, pink stone, used in the construction of buildings and streets in the late 1800s
- 4. Passages that went up and down, in mines, that did NOT go to the surface
- 6. A mine that is open to the sky, without underground tunnels
- 8. Used to fuel nuclear power plants responsible for producing electricity, in the 1950s
