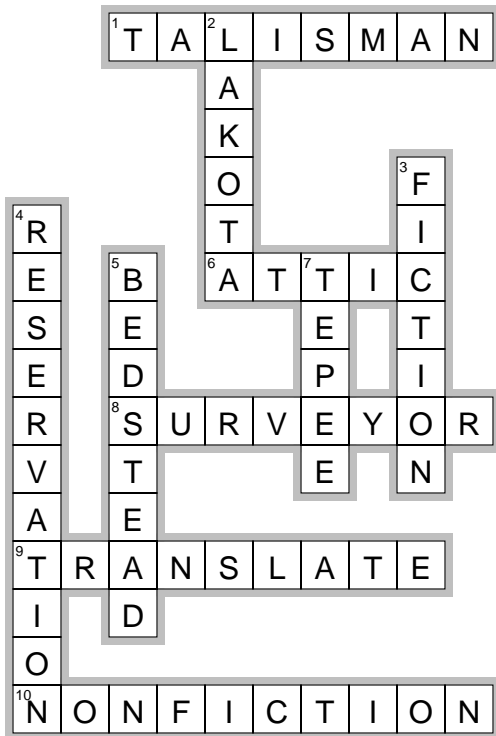

1. TALISMAN — an object held to act as a charm to avert evil and bring good fortune
6. ATTIC — a room or a space immediately below the roof of a building
8. SURVEYOR — one that determines and delineates the form, extent, and position of (as a tract of land) by taking linear and angular measurements and by applying the principles of geometry and trigonometry
9. TRANSLATE — to turn into one's own or another language
10. NONFICTION — literature that is not fictional

2. LAKOTA — Group of Native Americans, which includes the tribes of Itazipco, Oohenunpa, Sihasapa, Oglala, Sicangu, Hunkpapa, Hohwoju, Minneconjou and Titonwan
3. FICION — something invented by the imagination or feigned; specifically : an invented story
4. RESERVATION — a tract of land set apart by the federal government for a special purpose, especially one for the use of a Native American people
5. BEDSTEAD — the framework of a bed

7. TEPEE — a conical tent usually consisting of skins and used especially by American Indians of the Plains
