Fact vs. Opinion

When you are reading, it is important to be able to distinguish between facts and opinions.

Written materials such as articles, website information, biographies, and newspapers often contain both facts and opinions. Being able to tell them apart will help you judge the validity of a writer's ideas. It will also help you choose sources when doing research.

Spinners Inertia

What You Need:

Unshelled raw egg, a timer, a buddy, pen & paper to draw a table

What To Do:

Place egg on a flat surface. Spin the egg and observe. Spin again, but have your buddy time how long it takes to top spinning. Record the time. Repeat three times. Make an effort to use the same amount of force each trial. Did your time vary, why? What are the possible reasons for the changes in time? Try again with a hard boiled egg!

Mystery Vacation
