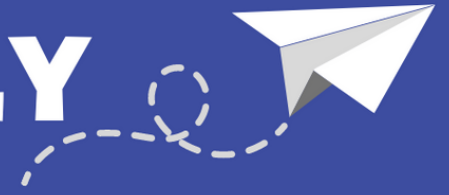




# LESSONS ON THE FLY

**Lesson Title:** Communicating at Work

**Subject:** ELA

## Directions:

1. Facilitate a discussion about how students might use English skills as adults in the workplace. If students struggle to answer, use the “[think-pair-share](#)” method to activate engagement. Ask questions like:
  - a. “Why do you learn English in school?”
  - b. “How do adults use English in their lives?”
  - c. “What do you want to be when you grow up, and will you need English skills to do that job?”
2. Introduce students to the [interactive, self-paced lesson](#). Remind them to read/watch all media and thoroughly answer questions. (Students will need to either create a free PBS Learning Media account or record their answers on paper.)
3. Once students have finished, have them discuss both what they have learned and the self-paced process they used. You may want to use the following questions:
  - a. What did you learn?
  - b. What was surprising?
  - c. What questions do you still have?
  - d. What was the easiest for you to understand and do? What was the most difficult?
