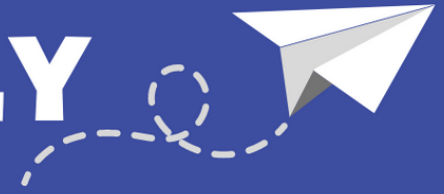

Lesson Title: Women Are Warriors Too!

Subject: Social Studies

Grade: 6-8

Step 1: Facilitate a discussion about what a warrior is. Use the “think-pair-share” model to have students share their answers to the following questions:

- Describe the attributes you think a warrior should have.
- Describe what a warrior might look like.
- Name a warrior you can think of - living, dead, or fictional.
- Does that person have the attributes you listed above?
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Step 2: Explain to students that they will be learning about Minnie Hollow Wood, a female warrior from the Lakhota tribe.

Step 3: Share the interactive, self-paced lesson with students, with a reminder to read/watch all media and answer each question thoroughly.

(Students will need to either create a free PBS Learning Media account or record their answers on paper.)

Step 4: After students have finished, you may want to have them discuss both what they have learned and the
