Air Pollution/Health	Healthy Air Healthy Communities 112	1/23/14 1/26/14	7:00pm 10:30pm	30 minutes 30 minutes	This episode focused on Gas tax and road maintenance. Viewers could learn how gas is taxed and where the tax dollars go. The program also made the connection of how taxes affect and pay for road maintenance. Viewers learned that driving less means less road maintenance and less tax dollars being raised.
Community Sustainability	A Millennial Plan for 2040	2/25/14	7:00pm	60 minutes	This live, interactive forum featured six area experts to discuss Evansville's new Millennial Plan for 2040. The panel discussed the need for the plan and why having a comprehensive plan for making the community more focused on sustainability will attract new residents and businesses that will make the community more economically sustainable.
Air Pollution/Health	Healthy Air Healthy Communities 114	3/20/14 3/25/14	7:00pm 10:30pm	30 minutes	This episode focused on recent legislation that will impose more controls on scooter and mopeds. Interviews with a State Representative and local Police Officer explained the proposed restrictions and the benefits these changes will provide. The program also focused on various after-market conversions that increase gas consumption and decrease road wear including tires, and engine modifications.

Each person was interviewed by a High School or College student who then presented their thoughts and impressions of the interview and described similarities between the Depression Era and the present.
Community History	100 Years of Rotary	2/27/14	7:00pm	30 minutes	This program looked at the history of the Evansville Rotary Club through interviews with past presidents, current members, and the younger members of Rotarac. The services provided by the club and it's members was highlighted.
War Veterans	Carry Forward: Tri-State Vets Back Home	2/6/14	7:00pm	30 minutes	This locally-produced program featured testimonials from local war veterans as they described their trials with integrating back into society after the war. Viewers gained insight into the mental, social, and economic problems that most Vets faced returning from service.

Judy Woodruff gets reaction from Dr. Ronald Depinho of the M.D. Anderson Cancer Center and Stephanie Strom of The New York Times.
