The subjects highlighted in each episode were picked by a panel of local media and community reps.

American History	Klansville USA: American Experience	1/13/15	8:00pm	60 minutes	Investigate the reasons North Carolina, long seen as the most progressive state in the South, became home to the largest Klan organization in the country, with more members than all the other Southern states combined, during the 1960s.
American Biography	James Baker: The Man Who Made Washington Work	3/24/15	7:30pm	90 minutes	Review the story of a remarkable politician and statesman. James A. Baker III, now 84, helped elect three presidents, served in top posts for two of them and was a central player in momentous events of the late 20th century. With candid testimony from Baker and firsthand accounts from former presidents Clinton, Carter and Bush Sr., former Secretaries of State Rice and Kissinger, former Vice President Cheney, other Washington insiders, journalists and historians, this
