

**9.1 WNIN-TV Program/Topic Report

There follows a listing of some of the significant issues responded to by WNIN-TV, Evansville, IN, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period 7/1/16 – 9/30/16. This listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

Arts/Music	An Evansville Ballet: The Little Mermaid	7/14/16	7:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced special featured the Evansville Youth Orchestra and the Evansville Youth Ballet in a performance of "The Little Mermaid".
Local History	The Field That Bosse Built	8/25/16	7:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced documentary focused on the history behind Bosse Field, one of the oldest sports fields in the U.S. It examined the history of the field and the changes and events over the course of its history. Local sports figures and major players in the field's development were featured.
Local Culture	Music From Jefferson's Monticello	9/1/16	7:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced concert featured music from Jefferson's era played by world renowned musicians during a recent performance in New Harmony Indiana. Between songs audiences were treated to short history lessons on the origins of the music and their relationship to Thomas Jefferson's home, Monticello.
Local History	Picture This "African American History/Local Breweries"	7/11/16	9:30pm	30 minutes	This episode of a series of five, focused on Evansville's African American History and Evansville's Breweries. Viewers saw original photographs while experts explained each photo.
Driving Safety	Life in the Safe Lane	8/18/16 8/21/16	10:30pm 9:30am	30 minutes	This local program educated viewers about safe driving issues such as roundabouts, distracted driving, traffic incident management, and other issues.
Agriculture	PBS Newshour	9/13/16	6:00pm	10 minutes	Is this a farm helping migrants or just a field of schemes? It seemed like a rare positive story about the migrant crisis: African refugees, relocated to Sardinia from their war-torn countries, providing for themselves by farming. But when the NewsHour arrived at the farm, no workers were there. Special correspondent Malcolm Brabant's ensuing investigation was winding and, at times, hostile. Were there ever any farmers, or was something else going on?
Crime/Legal Issues/Law Enforcement	PBS NewsHour	9/15/16	6:00pm	11 minutes	How hackers could prey on election vulnerabilities: This week, emails written by former Secretary of State Colin Powell, which were critical of Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton, appeared on a website that's reportedly an outlet for hackers tied to Russia. Judy Woodruff speaks with Dmitri Alperovitch of CrowdStrike and David Sanger of The New York Times about the recent wave of hacks tied to the presidential campaign and the impact on the election.

Education	Ted Talks	9/13/16	9:00pm	60 minutes	Education Revolution, hosted by author, producer and comedian Baratunde Thurston and actor and singer Sara Ramirez, focuses on how education is changing to adapt to our new digital world. The program features talks from educator Sal Khan, who examines what the classroom might look like in the future and the impact of online teaching, Victor Rios, who takes a deep dive into the problems of the school-to-prison pipeline, and Principal Nadia Lopez, whose middle school is in the most dangerous borough in New York and where almost all her students live below the poverty line. TED Talks: Education Revolution also addresses the issue of over-parenting with some revolutionary ideas from Julie Lythcott-Haims, author of How to Raise an Adult, who believes chores and love are more important than a check-listed childhood. The program also features music from Meshell Ndegeocello and a performance piece from the legendary Anna Deavere Smith from her one-woman show, Notes from the Field: Doing Time in Education.

Community	Regional Voices	9/18/16	10:00am	30 minutes	YMCA Boxing Representatives talk about the Y's programs and the benefits of youth programs to the community.
