Local Transportation	In Harmony's Way: The Battle to Save a Bridge	4/2/15 4/6/15	4:00pm 6:00pm	60 minutes	This documentary highlighted New Harmony Bridge that linked New Harmony, Indiana with Illinois and was the road that many traveled to get to work and shop. The bridge was recently closed due to structural problems and local citizens were lobbying the State to pay for repairs
State Legislation	Indiana Week in Review	Mondays at 5pm, Tuesdays at 4:30pm, Thursdays at 5pm and Fridays at 4pm		30 minutes	This weekly program features a look at the issues facing Indiana citizens. Each issue is debated between a variety of guests with different backgrounds and viewpoints.
Indiana Business	Inside Indiana Business	Sundays at 6pm, Mondays at 4pm, Tuesdays at 5pm, Weds at 6pm, and Fridays at 6pm.		60 minutes	This weekly series features up-to-date business news from the State. Highlights include business innovations, expansions, news, mergers, etc. The series is hosted by Gerry Dick.
Legal Issues	Indiana Courts	Sundays at 5pm, Tuesdays at 6pm, and Saturdays at 4pm		60 minutes	This series consists of various Indiana Supreme Court appeals that have occurred over the past several years. These trials portray a variety of cases and crimes and allow viewers to hear the arguments and rulings.
Legal History	Magna Carta: An Enduring Legacy	4/15/15	6:00PM	90 minutes	This documentary highlighted the 800th anniversary of the Magna Carta, when the Indiana State Bar Association hosted the American Bar Association Magna Carta Facsimile Traveling Exhibit curated by the Law Library of Congress at the Indiana Statehouse during its fall meeting.
Revitalization	Heading For Home	5/4/15	6:00pm	30 minutes	In 2011, the historic Bush Stadium in Indianapolis, Indiana became the first adaptive reuse of a sports facility for housing in US History. "Heading For Home" tells the story of this undertaking and explores the culture of sustainability in Indianapolis. This project was funded by the WIPB program initiative and was produced by Ball State University Digital Storytelling students Kayla Eiler and Alina Beteringhe.
Education	Little Children, Big Returns	5/11/15	6:00pm	30 minutes	A stimulating look at why it makes economic sense for Indiana to invest in state-funded early childhood education. Indiana has been one of only ten states in the nation without public funding for preschool. In its most recent session, the Indiana general assembly took a small but important step in providing limited funding to a pilot program in 2014. But is it enough? Through interviews with some of Indiana's top leaders working to help improve Indiana education, this 30 minute documentary makes the case for why Indiana cannot sit on the sidelines in this important issue.
Personal Finances	A Penny Saved	6/3/15	5:00pm	60 minutes	A Penny Saved is a guide for teachers, youth program leaders and parents as they look for the most effective ways to teaching financial literacy in the Hoosier state. Focusing on the lessons taught by the public television series Biz Kids, as well as Indiana programs and resources, A Penny Saved explores what works and what doesn't in helping kids make "cents" of their future.
