Arts/Culture	New Vision: New Harmony	6/15/16	7:00pm	60 minutes	This documentary highlighted New Harmony's culture through a look at the history, people, and current atmosphere.
State Legislation	Indiana Week in Review	Mondays at 5pm, Tuesdays at 4:30pm, Thursdays at 5pm and Fridays at 4pm		30 minutes	This weekly program features a look at the issues facing Indiana citizens. Each issue is debated between a variety of guests with different backgrounds and viewpoints.
Indiana Business	Inside Indiana Business	Sundays at 6pm, Mondays at 4pm, Tuesdays at 5pm, Weds at 6pm, and Fridays at 6pm.		60 minutes	This weekly series features up-to-date business news from the State. Highlights include business innovations, expansions, news, mergers, etc. The series is hosted by Gerry Dick.
Legal Issues	Indiana Courts	Sundays at 5pm, Tuesdays at 6pm, and Saturdays at 4pm		60 minutes	This series consists of various Indiana Supreme Court appeals that have occurred over the past several years. These trials portray a variety of cases and crimes and allow viewers to hear the arguments and rulings.
History/Biography	Lew Wallace	4/14/16	4pm	90 minutes	Lew Wallace (1827-1905) is one of the most significant Hoosiers in the state's history. Wallace played a leading role in the country's military, political, diplomatic, and literary affairs during the 19th-century. His lasting fame however would ultimately come from writing Ben-Hur: A Tale of the Christ, one of the most successful books of all time. Beyond his role as author and a soldier, Wallace also was a lawyer, serving on the commissions that tried two of the most infamous acts of the Civil War; was Governor of the New Mexico territory where he interacted with the notorious outlaw Bill the Kid; and served as Minister to the Ottoman Empire in Constantinople where he befriended the Sultan.
Black History	Indiana Trailblazers 101	4/20/16	5:00pm	60 minutes	Trace the steps of African-Americans as they migrate from the southern slave states and organize prosperous black settlements and thriving commerce centers across Indiana. You will learn about the state's black legislators in the early 1900's, including attorney Henry J. Richardson (deceased) who was on the front lines of the legal fight for equality across Indiana and the country, as told by his sons for the first time. Richardson's landmark legal and civic work serve as a backdrop for the discussion regarding disparate treatment, socially and educationally, as more state black leaders emerge and join the fight for racial equality.
Politics	Bill Hudnut	5/20/16	4:30pm	30 minutes	If there is one name most people associate with the turnaround of Indianapolis from "Indy-a-no-place" to a Super City, it's William Hudnut, the

					town's mayor from 1976 to 1992. A larger-than-life presence in politics, the "Minister Mayor" galvanized central INdiana's civic leaders into thinking about downtown re-development in new ways, philosophies which have carried on into the present era. Now living in Washington DC, but in declining health, Hudnut look back at this life and his legacy, remaining characteristically optimistic about the future, no matter the odds.
History	Along the Wabash River	5/26/16	4pm	60 minutes	Travel along the Wabash River and discover the inspiring stories of the people who lived alongside it - from Tecumseh's attempt to form a pan-Indian coalition to the experimental societies of New Harmony, and many destinations in between. Along The Wabash combines historical first-hand accounts, poetry, music and narration with fictionalized scenes of history, imagination, and beauty.
