WNIN News	1/4/17	6:45am	1:00	IN's largest teacher union, ISTA, presented their legislative priorities which include the goal of training teachers to recognize and work with student trauma. ISTA president, Teresa Meredith, said ¼ children in the US deal with some sort of trauma at home. She suggests the legislature create a grant program to train teachers. ISTA also wants more equitable school funding, expanded state-funded Pre-K, and to pull student test scores out of teacher evaluations.

A group of students at Milan High School visited the National Gallery in London via a virtual tour on their laptops. Small rural schools have to invest hundreds of thousands of dollars and sacrifice other things such as structural repairs to make this type of learning possible.

The decrease in opioid prescriptions written may have led people to switch to heroin which is cheaper but more dangerous and can be laced with fentanyl, another opioid that can kill small quantities. This nationwide issue is more pronounced in Marion County. Increased access to addiction medications and treatment providers can improve the situation.

Local leaders created six forums this spring to help residents recognize and prevent suicide.
